Manitoba Conservation and Climate, in cooperation with a number of other provincial government departments, has recently begun work on the preparation of a Provincial Trails Strategy. This Strategy will address all types of recreational trails in Manitoba, including motorized, non-motorized and mixed-use trails, and will consider a number of aspects such as trail development and maintenance, funding mechanisms, tourism amenities, and the reduction of regulatory barriers. In order to achieve this task, the government is seeking input from trail users, builders, communities and other potentially interested individuals and organizations.

This email is to inform you that we have launched a survey directed at current and potential trail users. We hope that you will be able to take the time to complete the survey, found [here](#), and/or share this information with your organization's membership or contacts to encourage individual participation in the survey. By completing the survey, respondents will have the opportunity to share their views on what they value in a recreational trail network, barriers to using trails, and how to get people more involved with using and supporting trails.

This survey will be open until **January 15th, 2021**. Once it has closed and the survey results have been analyzed, the input received will be considered during the process of developing the Trails Strategy.
